

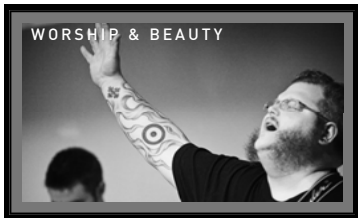
CORE VALUES | the essence of who we are as the Body of Christ
